EXHIBITIONS



Seeing the Invisible: An Augmented Reality Contemporary Art Exhibition

Through August 31, 2022

The most ambitious and expansive exhibition to date of contemporary artworks created with augmented reality (AR) technology, *Seeing the Invisible* was installed at Selby Gardens' Historic Spanish Point campus last year as one of 12 participating gardens across six countries. *Seeing the Invisible* features works by more than a dozen international artists, including Ai Weiwei, Refik Anadol, El Anatsui, and Sarah Meyohas—including several artists' debut work in AR. Visitors engage with the exhibition through a custom app downloadable to smartphones and tablets. Forging new links between botanical gardens located in diverse biomes around the globe, *Seeing the Invisible* fosters collaboration between institutions, artists, and audiences, highlighting the power of art in a natural setting to connect people around the world.



Robert Mapplethorpe and Patti Smith: Flowers, Poetry, and Light

February 13 to June 26

Selby Gardens spotlights the work of Robert Mapplethorpe, one of the foremost photographers of the 20th century, together with the words of legendary singer-songwriter, author, and poet Patti Smith. Marking the sixth edition of the annual Jean & Alfred Goldstein Exhibition Series, which explores the work of major artists through the lens of their connection to nature, *Flowers, Poetry, and Light* puts a selection of Mapplethorpe's photographs of orchids, hyacinths, and irises and excerpts of Smith's poems and lyrics on flowers and nature in dialogue with new horticultural installations inspired by the two artists' work.
