CONDITIONS:

- Photographs must follow the theme of one of the above categories and must be original; taken within the last two years and taken on the grounds of Selby Gardens (at either the Downtown Sarasota or Historic Spanish Point campus); not previously awarded a prize in Marie Selby Botanical Gardens' annual photographic contest; and owned by the registrant
- Photos must be submitted digitally; there will be no in-person submissions accepted
- Entry is open to amateurs only
- Entry is open to Selby Gardens volunteers; however, photos taken in the capacity of volunteer service and owned by Selby Gardens may not be submitted
- No watermarks on images
- Entry fee must accompany submission:
 - Selby Gardens' Members: First entry \$30, \$10 for each additional (up to three entries total)
 - Non-members: First entry \$45, \$15 for each additional (up to three entries total)
- Maximum of three entries per person allowed
- Photos with faces of people that are clearly visible will not be accepted
- Any photograph not accompanied by its proper entry form and fee will not be considered for the exhibit
- All entries subject to acceptance for exhibition. Juried awards are final and not negotiable. All accepted entries and winners will subsequently be posted to selby.org and yourobserver.com
- Cropping is permitted, but no special effects or techniques such as adding or removing objects, etc., allowed
