#### MANGROVE WALKWAY COMPLETED AHEAD OF SCHEDULE It's done!

#### Nov 11: *Blazing Bladen's Blue River in Search of Epiphytes* Great Room by the Bay, 12:00 – 1:00 p.m.

In May 2015, another Selby Gardens team returned to Belize as part of an ongoing collaboration with Belize's Caves Branch Botanical Garden. The purpose was to conduct a botanical inventory focused on epiphytes in a remote area that was last

inhabited some 1,500 years ago by the Mayan civilization. ### Friday, Nov 13, 12 – 1 in the Activities Center Classroom

**Understanding What Makes Bromeliads Tick** presented by Jamie Males, Harry Luther-Bromeliad Society International Scholar and Ph.D. student at Cambridge University

Males' research focuses on the evolution and physiology of the bromeliad family, with the aim of understanding how variation at the molecular and anatomical level determines species' physiological limits. The real-world importance of these physiological limits can be tested by examining how well they explain the known distributions of different species. He also seeks to use evolutionary models to establish whether the impressive rates of diversification observed in certain bromeliad lineages are associated with evolutionary changes in specific traits. His work therefore spans the full circle of biology: from the bench, to the field, to the computer desk

# Dec 2, The Botanic Gardens of Leiden and Oxford with Dr. David Berry in the Great Room by the Bay, 12:00 – 1:00 p.m.

The university cities of Leiden, the Netherlands, and Oxford, England, are home to two of the oldest botanic gardens in the world. The gardens still occupy their original sites, dating from the late sixteenth and early seventeenth centuries respectively. This

illustrated talk will feature interesting anecdotes on the history of the gardens and the people and plants associated with them.

Dr. Berry is the Assistant Director of Academic Affairs at the John and Mable Ringling Museum of Art. He has been working as a consultant with Selby Gardens since 2014.


### EXHIBITS IN THE MUSEUM OF BOTANY AND THE ARTS

#### Gardens of the Mind - Dr. Joel Elkes at 102: A Retrospective features the artist's career-spanning works, including some created just this year. At nearly 102 years of age, Dr. Elkes was not ready to "throw in the brushes." His paintings reflect a love affair with nature and a curiosity about the relation of light to objects that began during his childhood in Lithuania and endures today.

He continued to be inspired by "conversations" with nature and was even more focused and

# WHAT'S IN BLOOM – by Terri Tumlin


The wonderful weather continues and the Garden is beautiful. This month I toured the area around the Mansion.



1. Just south of the Mansion in the bromeliad garden, *Hohenbergia stellata* is displaying a lovely pink bloom.



2 In front of the Mansion, along the walk on the east side, the porterweed (*Stachytarpheta mutabilis*) has small clear red flowers blooming in sequence up the green spikes.



3. Along the same path, near the arbor, the cat's whiskers (Orthosiphon sp.) is in spectacular display with its white blossoms.

4. On the west side of the path, just south of the arbor Holmskioldia tettensis has lovely purple flowers with of lavender bracts..

5. Along the southern end of the path just in front of the Mansion, the bright red blooms of autumn sage (Salvia greggii) will catch your eye.
